

They shall be given the opportunity to complete assignments and tests within a reasonable time, based on the circumstances. These absences should be managed in the same manner as absences for other excused reasons, including informing the school of the absence, talking with teachers about the absence(s) and missed work, etc. (*Religious Observance Policy – I 340*).

Religious Observance Policy - I-340

Overview

The Vision of the Public Schools of Northborough and Southborough as articulated in its strategic plan states that our belief in appreciating the diversity, differences and dignity of all members of the community and that providing a comprehensive educational experience to support and nurture all students' intellectual, creative, social and emotional development and physical well-being are shared core values. It is our belief that students be provided time to freely participate in their religious activities without conflict and that differences in practices will not be uniform or subject to evaluation and opinion.

Faculty, Parents & Students

1. Teaching faculty shall make every effort to accommodate all students who, because of religious obligations, have conflicts with scheduled exams, assignments, or other required attendance; provided, (5) school days advanced notice of the scheduled conflict is provided.
2. A student will be given two school days to make up any new classroom work introduced on the day of a religious observance.
3. Any student absent due as a result of a religious observance will be marked "excused absence" for the length of the observation when a note, signed by a parent/guardian indicating the reason for such absence is presented and approved by the Principal's Office. Whenever possible, students should notify faculty at least one week (5) school days in advance of an absence for such purposes. This policy applies to academics, athletics and extracurricular/co-curricular activities.

Education for All

The District is committed to respecting the diversity and appreciates the importance of providing information that will create a climate of sensitivity and knowledge regarding the religious beliefs and practices of students in our schools. Time will be devoted in our professional development calendar to educate our teachers.
